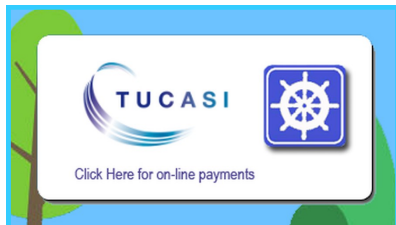

Headteacher's message

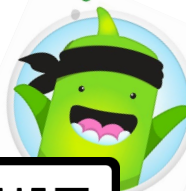

Pupil of the week!

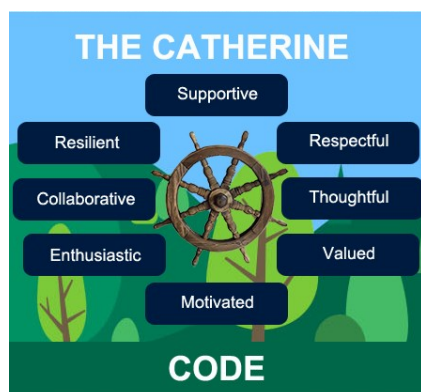
Every two weeks, teachers choose 1 or 2 children in their class who have demonstrated the values of the Catherine Code. Their pictures are proudly displayed in school.

eSafety

Filters: In school, we use the filter **Netsweeper** to make sure inappropriate content cannot be seen. It is important that **you** use filters at home for your broadband devices and mobiles. Scan the code for a guide to setting this up.

Do you watch your children play online? Not letting your child go into a room where you cannot see them or their screen is very effective in limiting access to inappropriate online content. If you can see their reactions to what they are viewing online, then you are better placed to support them. Children who are left to access devices alone, such as in their bedrooms, are at a greatly increased risk of harm from strangers trying to make contact online.
