Internet safety

Keeping children safe on the internet becomes more and more of a challenge. Catherine junior School we want to help parents in keeping their children safe online. We know that children are signing up to apps and accounts online when they are not old enough. Using family accounts can still be a risk.

Why Do Age Restrictions Matter?

To keep them safe, children must be aged 12 and over and at least 135cm tall before they are allowed to sit in the front passenger seat of a car using an adult seat belt. Age restrictions are about keeping children safe until they are old enough to engage with an activity with complete awareness of what they're letting themselves in for.

Do You Know Your Social Media Age Restrictions?

The majority of social media sites such as **Twitter, Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram, Pinterest** have a minimum age requirement of **13**. YouTube is 18, although a child can sign up to YouTube account at just 13 with their parent's permission. **WhatsApp** has a minimum age requirement of **16**.

Children at Catherine Junior School are too young to be using these apps. It is important that we ensure children are safe online by following these rules.
